GDC Work Programme

GDC has been constantly trying to expand its operations by way of leveraging partnerships, network development and sustainability. It is vigorously attempting to work towards attainment of its aims and objectives through multi-stakeholder engagement. GDC has also entered into a new partnership with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to expand its working within India in Agriculture and Nutrition, Health, STI & Digital Technologies, Women's Economic Empowerment etc.

It is also cross leveraging with a number of eminent institutions to widen its footprint by engaging with Paris Peace Forum, World Bank, NPCI International Payments Limited, Institute for Development & Research in Banking Technology, National Health Authority under Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, International Solar Alliance, Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure, Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry, Confederation of Indian Industry, Public Health Foundation of India, Self Employed Women's Association, etc. as its key Technical Partners.

GDC also strongly supports the accelerated growth of South–South and Triangular Cooperation, including the important role being played by the annual international conference called 'Delhi Process' and helps it in drawing up its agenda for deliberations by a large body of international subject experts, policy makers and shapers, including national and international development experts.

Development Cooperation Review Journal is also regularly published under the auspices of GDC. The Journal carries a wide range of contributions by leading scholars, commentators, and practitioners of Development Cooperation in general and South-South Cooperation (SSC) in particular. It has evolved an effective network of Southern scholars, practitioners, and policy makers. Linkages have also been developed with organizations like Forum for Indian Development Cooperation, Network of Southern Think Tanks, United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation, OECD Development Centre etc., for exchanging ideas on international development cooperation.
