





INTRODUCTION »

The Self-Employed Women's Association (SEWA) and its sister organisation the Lok Swasthya SEWA Trust (LSST), in partnership with the Global Development Centre (GDC), Research Information System for Developing Countries(RIS) are pleased to announce the launch of the GDC Fellowship Programme on Women's Economic Empowerment.

Based on SEWA's experience of more than 47 years in India, in 2012, the Government of India invited SEWA to set up similar interactions and exchanges with five African countries, namely Ethiopia, Tanzania, South Africa, Ghana and Senegal. This programme was called SETU Africa, 'setu' meaning bridge in Indian languages. SETU Africa aims to provide support by way of sharing experiences and also concrete capacity-building inputs, based on SEWA's own years of tested and tried experiences at the grassroots level.

SEWA believes that mutual learning and cooperation among member-based organizations and government agencies of India, Africa and South Asia will strengthen each of these organizations.

The objective of the current training programme is to promote South-South cooperation and mutual learning on how to achieve women's economic empowerment in a sustainable manner.

Lok Swasthya Sewa Trust (LSST)

The Lok Swasthya SEWA Trust (LSST) was established in the year 2005 in Ahmedabad, Gujarat by the Lok Swasthya Mandli (SEWA's health co-operative) to improve the well-being of informal women workers and their families. The health co-operative is managed by informal women workers with an approach that leads to sustainability.

LSST organises women for self-reliance, both financial and in terms of decision-making and helps them obtain full employment at the household level translating to better socio-economic and health status. The Chairperson of LSST is always a woman from the informal sector, hence recognising their leadership and centrality to all that we do and have accomplished. In addition to our grassroots action, we bring the issues of women workers directly to the attention of policy-makers and legislators at district, state, regional, national and global levels, and in their own voices.

To achieve its vision of empowering women, LSST takes up women's felt needs and demands from the grassroots level and coordinate with local, state and national level government functionaries and institutions. As a result it works closely with local governance committee such as panchayats and their sarpanch, Village Health Sanitation and Nutrition Committee (VHSNC) and Municipal Corporations among others to ensure proper implementation and outreach. LSST works in a service-cum-rights-based approach with communities of informal workers which throws up new avenues for constructive local action and appropriate changes at the policy level. Following in Gandhi's footsteps, LSST work towards decentralising control, strengthening decision- making by women and placing resources and, information, in their hands to enable them to do effective planning, implementation and monitoring.
