## DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION REVIEW

Development Cooperation Review (DCR) is a refereed multi-disciplinary international quarterly journal brought out by Global Development Centre at Research and Information System for Developing Countries (RIS), New Delhi. The journal serves as a forum for discussion on issues related to global development cooperation and fills an important knowledge gap towards theorisation, empirical verification and documentation of Southern-led development cooperation processes.

DCR invites contribution on issues related to development cooperation in general and South-South Cooperation (SSC) practices in particular. Contributions should highlight narratives on development cooperation, SSC practices and associated debates on development cooperation. Reviews of latest publications on themes of development cooperation such as books, monographs, and reports are also welcome. The journal encourages practitioners and policy makers to share their experiences and perspectives on SSC projects.

Manuscripts are to be sent in MS-Word to <u>editordcr@gdcin.org.</u> Submissions should contain institutional affiliation and complete mailing address of author(s). All submissions will be acknowledged on receipt.

## **Guidelines for Contributors**

Manuscripts should be prepared using double spacing. Research articles/papers should ordinarily be around 5000 words with a 200-word abstract, and key words up to six. Book reviews should be limited to 1000 words. Submission of practitioners' perspective should not be more than 1000-1200 words. Use of graphs, tables and pictures is encouraged in the manuscripts.

Use 's' in '-ise' '-isation' words; e.g., 'civilise', 'organisation'. Use British spellings rather than American spellings. Thus, 'labour' not 'labor'.

Use figures (rather than word) for quantities and exact measurements including percentages (2.1 per cent, 3 km, 36 years old, etc.). In general descriptions, numbers below 10 should be spelt out in words. Use thousands, millions, billions, not lakhs and crores. Use fuller forms for numbers and dates – for example 1980-88, pp. 200-202 and pp. 178-84. Specific dates should be cited in the form June 2, 2004. Decades and centuries may be spelt out, for example 'the eighties', 'the twentieth century', etc

**Reference Style:** References should be appended at the end of the paper. References must be in double space, and same author(s) should be cited, and then arranged chronologically by year of publication. All references should be embedded in the text in the **APA** style.
